How do I dispute the claim?

You may request a hearing to dispute the validity of the claim. To do so, you must send written notice to our office at the address listed below. We must receive the request within 45 days of the date of this notice. If you make a request, we will schedule a hearing within 30 days and notify you of the date, time, and place for the hearing.

Am I exempt from Revenue Recapture?

You may be exempt from Revenue Recapture if the debt is an overpayment of assistance and you are currently receiving (See Minnesota Statutes 270A.03, subdivision 5, for a definition of guidelines):

- Food support, transitional care, or transitional medical assistance.
- Assistance and you have not signed a waiver authorizing Revenue Recapture.
- Assistance and there is not an administrative or judicial finding that you intentionally violated the terms of the assistance program.
